There is something very seductive about a well-designed chair and style slaves have been following the well-beaten path to those modernist nordic geniuses of the 20th century - but no more with this stunning Brace Chair made right here in Devon

First launched in prototype form at London Design Week and exhibited at the Cologne and New York furniture fairs, the well-travelled Brace Rocker is part of a striking range of furniture designed by Ben Huggins.

Noted for its light-weight frame and seat, the Brace Rocker has been inspired by the use of simple structural methods and techniques

usually associated with more industrial applications. Truss principals and cross bracing are used to achieve a light-weight but strong structure, seamlessly laser-cut from aluminium, while the laminated oak seat is designed to work with the body's natural form.

The chair's innovative 'soft rock' motion makes it more versatile than a traditional rocker, leaning

forwards and backwards in line with the body's natural movement.

Ideal for both dining and desk use, the Brace Rocker is now available in leather, aluminium and oak combinations through Touch Design Group. The furniture is part of a wider product range currently in development. ■
